### Memphis Lafferty Hunt

In the early February, of 2020, I was contacted by Scot McClure and Sean McLelland of the Outdoors Tomorrow Foundation, a worthwhile program supported in part by the SCFW, about possibly doing a hunt with a young man named Memphis Lafferty, a quad amputee 14 year old who was a student in one of the foundation's classes at Marcus High School. They sent me a news clip showing Memphis shooting a crossbow and I felt like we could somehow get him shooting a rifle thus enabling him to hunt.

We set the date for the first weekend in October. The hunt would be filmed by CRCS Outdoor Productions to be aired on The Pursuit Channel at a later date. I already had a Deathgrip Bog tripod to shoot from and a few AR platform rifles that have minimal recoil. The biggest challenge would be operating the trigger. I reached out to my friend and patriot, Retired USMC Sergeant Marcus Burleson, a bomb technician who lost both arms in Afghanistan in an IED explosion and asked him what he would recommend? He told me that he used a Bite Trigger from B Adaptive and that he would bring one for Memphis to use. I was now set to hopefully get Memphis behind the stock and shooting at my range.

Memphis suffered from bacterial meningitis at the age of 6 months. He had to have both legs and arms amputated. His father, Chris, has been his caretaker ever since. Memphis has had many challenges as one might imagine! He has prosthetics, but seems more comfortable trying to do things without them and does a very good job. He is very independent and takes care of himself pretty well. I don't consider him to have disabilities, but instead he has enhanced



abilities. He eats and drinks with little to no assistance. He can text and perform many other functions that many of us take for granted. He is truly an inspiration to all who meet him.

Memphis and his father Chris arrived at the Ranch on Friday afternoon. My son Blayne, Scot McClure, and Tom Washburn, Camera Man from CRCs Outdoors were there to greet him as well as my friend Marcus Burleson who came out to teach Memphis to shoot. We got them settled in at the Bunk House and then went to the range to get him on the rifle. Marcus took over from there and we adjusted the stock as Marcus worked with him on shooting fundamentals from a similar viewpoint that none of the rest of us could realistically comprehend. He recommended biting on the trigger to activate it, but Memphis was more comfortable squeezing it between what is left of his arms.

Memphis fired 4 shots, all within 2 ½ inches of the bullseye and we were all excited to see him accomplish shooting with such success in such a short time. We stopped at the house for a snack and then off to the deer stand.

Memphis, Scot, Tom, Chris, and I got in the blind that I call “The Condo” on the north east corner of my ranch in a large wheat field. It took a bit, but we managed to get Memphis up the steps and into the blind. We then got the gun set up and Memphis behind it.

Shortly after getting Memphis into position, a nice aoudad ram came into the field and started working his way toward us. I told Memphis to get ready. When the Ram was within 100 yards, I told him to take it. Memphis fired and we saw that the ram was hit in the shoulder as he ran for the creek bottom to our right. Aoudad sheep are very hearty animals and I was concerned as to how far he might go with a 64 grain .223 bullet, so I decided to give him 15 minutes to expire and hopefully avoid the calamity that sometimes follows by not allowing a little time! While we waited, a few coyotes started barking

and howling in the distance. Memphis asked me “What was making that noise?” I told him and he got a very concerned look on his face. He asked “Can they could get to us in the blind?” I realized at that point how people who rarely get into the outdoors might fear things that those of us have never considered being afraid of. If a coyote makes the news, it has done something that most would be afraid of. I assured Memphis that we were safe and that he should not worry!

I got out of the blind while the others assisted Memphis getting down the stairs and went to find the sheep. I found him about 50 yards from where he was shot and he was very dead! I drug him several yards out of the canyon, I mean creek bottom, to the edge of the field about the time that the others showed up with Memphis in the UTV. We were very proud of Memphis and he was extremely happy with his trophy! We took pictures and then loaded the sheep in the back of the UTV and headed back to camp.

Support included the complete build of two ranges and all the equipment required for nine targets at each range. The biggest impact for both school groups visiting the Texas Outdoor Education Center and summer campers is access to shoot more during the time they are at the range; increasing their shooting time from 2 times in an hour up to five times in that same period! Representatives from the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth visited Camp El Tesoro in September 2019 to cut the ribbon on the two new archery ranges which were put to use with school groups in the remainder of 2019 and at Winter Family Camping in February 2020. The Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth has generously supported Camp Fire since 1995.

While we were hunting, Blayne had smoked pork tenderloins that we served with salad, mushrooms, asparagus, and rolls. We had a great celebratory dinner and I felt that a huge weight had been lifted off of me! I came up with a plan to assist getting Memphis in the blind the next morning, so Blayne and I took one of my tractors to the Condo so that I could set him on the platform of the blind.

On Saturday morning, after breakfast, we went back to the Condo to try our luck at getting Memphis a mature whitetail buck. We sat him on the edge of the bucket and with my superior operating capabilities, lifted up to the platform and got him into the blind. We saw a few young bucks along with does and fawns. Around mid-morning, we headed back to camp. Memphis wanted to try his hand at driving one of the UTVs and by now, I was convinced that he could do it! Like everything else, he figured a way and was tooling around with Chris having a good time!

For lunch, we went to Mary's Café in Strawn for her World Famous Chicken Fried Steak! Mary, a dear old friend of my family's came out to say hi and did not disappoint our guests with her steaks with fries and salad that were more than enough to satisfy all our appetites.

We drove back to the ranch and one of my friends, Colton Kyle, Chris Kyle's son had come out to meet Memphis and help out in any way. They became immediate friends! We rested up for the evening hunt. Before we went out, we had another guest show up to cook dinner, Fort Worth's favorite chef, Jon Bonnell! He brought Buffalo Tenderloin, Quail, and all the fixings including Truffle Butter for the bread!

We went back to the Condo for the evening hunt. When I started to get Memphis on the bucket, he let me know that I had scared the hell out of him that morning and that he could get up there himself! He removed his prosthetics and crawled up the stairs with no help. Looked kind of like a turtle! We didn't have any mature bucks show up. Memphis was still enjoying seeing the wildlife that presented itself and I had the opportunity to explain that hunting wasn't just about shooting animals, it involves patience to wait out the animal that you are truly seeking. Having never being out in this type setting, Memphis seemed to be taking it all in with wonderment.

It began to get dark and we headed back to camp for an excellent dinner that Jon had prepared. While Memphis and Colton talked about whatever teenage boys talk about, we discussed changing locations and decided to hunt another field the next morning. Scot would stay behind as it was going to be a tight fit for the four of us that would be in the blind.

Sunday morning, we went to the blind that we call South Central and settled in to hopefully get Memphis a buck. A young 8 pointer came in and the weight was back and getting heavier! I was considering taking him as I didn't want Memphis to go home without any meat, much less a trophy. About the time that I was going to tell Memphis to shoot him, a mature 8 point came into the field and my prayers were answered! I got Memphis set up on the nice buck and told him to shoot when he was ready. Memphis hit the buck in the shoulder and he was down 30 yards from where he hit him. The weight was gone again! While I went and posed the buck for pictures, the others assisted Memphis out of the blind. It was a great moment for us all!

Our hunt was over and we had all learned new things. We worked as a team and achieved what may have seemed impossible only a short time ago. I feel that Memphis gave me as much a gift as I gave him, maybe more? I learned that we can help ourselves a lot more than we think we can if we just try. I know that my worst day does not compare to Memphis' and that if he can have such charisma and personality, it should be a chip shot for most of us.

I have shared this experience with other like-minded people and have been able to get Memphis a rifle and all the things he needs to continue hunting in the future from the SCFW and other donors! If you are reading this and are able to somehow help out by taking someone who would otherwise not have an opportunity to hunt, please reach out to an organization that has access to those in need and do yourself, your friends, and family a favor!





## Delta Waterfowl's First Hunt Fort Worth

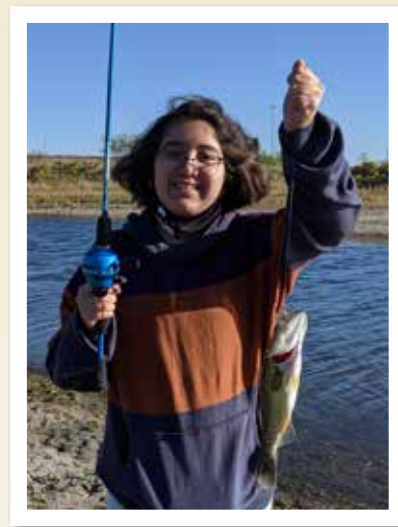
