The Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth started with four friends and outdoorsmen, Mickey Schmid, Paul Leonard, Jr., Charlie Stephens and Harry Tennison. Mickey's brother-in-law, Bobby Harmon, who lived in San Antonio, had an annual tradition: He and his hunting buddies cleaned game out of their freezers and got together to cook, drink whiskey, play cards and shoot dice. Bobby invited Mickey to these annual gatherings, and Mickey brought the idea back to Fort Worth. The annual Wild Game Dinner was born!

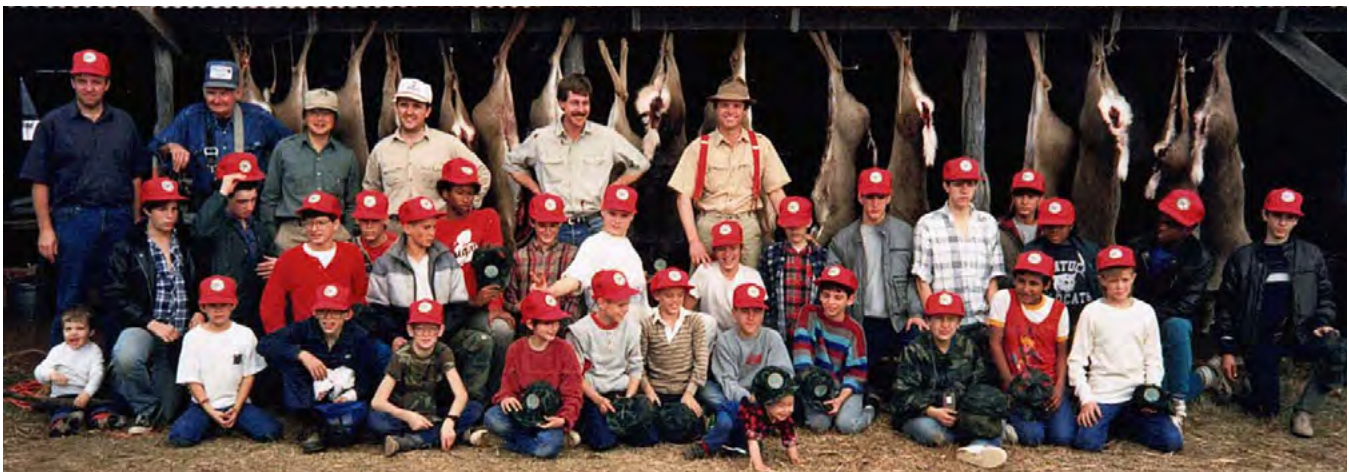
The event was just the beginning of the SCFW. Harry Tennison's in-laws owned a wonderful ranch in Jack County. He and Bob Leonard were deer hunting there one day and got into conversation with a couple of boys they encountered. When asked if they had ever shot a deer, the boys said no. With parental permission, they planned to take the boys on a deer hunt.

When the day arrived, the four of them settled into a blind and Harry let the boys practice looking through the scope and dry firing the rifle. After being there for a while a few deer appeared in a clearing not far from the blind. Harry gave the rifle to one of the boys and told him which one to shoot. The boy

made a good shot, and the doe went down. Upon walking up to the doe, it was clear that another shot was needed to kill the animal. They gave the rifle to the other boy who shot and finished it off.

The deer was loaded up and taken back to headquarters to clean. And of course, as is customary for anyone making their first kill, blood was smeared on each of the two boys faces. A few days later one of the boys' mothers called and told Harry how excited the boys were. She told them how much she appreciated he and Bob taking the boys hunting—and she would consider it a big favor if they would tell the boys that it was all right to wash the blood off their faces!

This hunting experience was the forerunner of the Jack County Deer Hunt. J.C. Romine, a local game warden, was instrumental in locating youth in Jack County to participate in the annual hunt sponsored by the SCFW. Youth from North Texas Field & Stream, Wichita Falls, the Masonic home and neighboring Wise County participated as well. This activity along with support of Operation Orphans near Mason Texas are examples of future hunting and fishing activities made possible by support from the SCFW.

SCFW support of the Granbury event allowed an event that had lost its coordinator to a job relocation out of state to continue as the community stepped up last minute and held the event for the children with special needs of their community. The event at the BK Ranch brought together children and families to have a special event held Halloween weekend where giant bluegill caught by children in various costumes made for a fun event for everyone. Finally, Lake Benbrook allowed young Annalynne her first ever boat ride. The joy she experienced was priceless!

HOMETOWN HERO OUTDOORS

Hometown Hero Outdoors (HHO) is a non-profit organization that is strengthening family bonds and helping its members deal with stress by affording them the opportunity to get outdoors. On December 3rd, ten members and their children arrived at the Lake Proctor Lodge near De Leon, Texas and were greeted by the HHO Texas Chapter field staff for a weekend of deer hunting and wild game processing.

The event started with introductions and a visit from a Texas Parks and Wildlife Game Warden. Warden Hornsby conducted a brief class of deer hunting requirements and regulations for Comanche County. He was able to check licenses and answer any questions the members and their children had.

Saturday started early with wake up at 4:00 am. The hunters loaded up with hot coffee, drinks and snacks for the hunting blind and loaded into trucks with their designated guides. The youth paired with their parent and spent some quality family time in the blind together. The morning hunt ended with three deer being harvested. Several other hunters passed on opportunities as they waited for that trophy buck to make an appearance. The evening hunt produced three more deer and two turkeys. Many of the deer taken were harvested by first time hunters. HHO strives to introduce youth to the outdoors to ensure our future generations continue to practice good conservation.

Once back at the lodge, everyone enjoyed some catered Texas BBQ and door prize giveaways from local donors while sitting around the table sharing stories of the day's hunt. Many new friendships were started, family bonds strengthened, and lessons on conservation learned.

Sunday began with the field staff preparing a pancake and sausage breakfast. Once packed and cleaned up, the group headed to the HHO Texas State Director Shaun Olsberg's farm where they learned about processing wild game and how to prepare wild game for the table. Everyone had a chance to take part in at least one step of the process. Each member was sent home to their families with venison that they had a part in harvesting.

Hometown Hero Outdoors originated in Minnesota in 2017 by a group of veterans and law enforcement officers to help serve others. The Texas chapter began December of 2020 and has since taken over 70 currently serving military, veterans or law enforcement officers into the outdoors. Their goal is to provide outdoor trips and family events to all members in Texas.





CampCARE 2021 saw many new cancer patients and caregivers, who got to try exciting activities and meet new friends!

The youngest camper this year was a rambunctious 4.5-year-old, Camden. Camp through Camden's eyes was special and magical! He even got to ride a horse for the first time! He was so brave and conquered his fear of riding "such a big animal." Camden took several laps around the horse arena, and like most kids, he did not want to get off his horse at the end of his time. Camden's mom was going through treatment at the time and said that CampCARE was a much-needed experience for Camden. He has seen his mom go through so much and had taken on the role of her caregiver, so it was nice for mom to see him be just a kid.

Reel Connection 2021 was met with perfect weather and an abundance of families in attendance!

Aiden is on his high school fishing team, so he eagerly grabbed his pole and got to work. He walked the entire pond, catching fish after fish, all with a huge smile on his face! He is such a spirited kid full of laughter, even though he is coping with the trauma of cancer. Aiden and his dad caught several largemouth bass and had a blast fishing together! His grandparents came in from Louisiana just for this event to spend time with their grandkids. Grandma said this was the perfect event for the family to do together because they could be outside and have fun safely.

The littlest fisherwoman, Lizzy, caught the most fish of the day, totaling 8! She reeled in one fish after another and named each one! Lizzy had recently returned from receiving intense chemo at St. Jude. Lizzy's mom said, "It was a very nice change of pace for us to do something different and relaxing without thinking about the demands of chemo. I love how helpful the state parks and rec group is. We very much appreciate the group at Cancer Care Services."

A huge thank you goes to Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth for bringing help and hope to cancer patients and caregivers!

DELTA WATERFOWL

Thanks to the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth, Delta Waterfowl hosted two outdoor youth events through its Cowtown (Fort Worth) and Hunter Retriever (North Tarrant County) Chapters. These events would not have been possible without the collaboration of the many community partners involved.

Delta's Cowtown Chapter held its 2021 Delta Cast and Blast with over 40 attendees. Seven participants fired their first shotgun and three fished for the first time. Everyone caught fish and a six shot their first clay target. Participants received a Delta hat, a Delta T-shirt with both SCFW and Delta logos, and copies of the Delta "Know thy Duck" pamphlet.

Delta's Hunter Retriever Chapter hosted its 14th Annual Delta Youth and Dog Hunting Camp. This weekend-long event was held at a private ranch near Zephyr and was the biggest camp to-date. This year, 31 total campers attended and learned everything from basic obedience training to commands used in the field. Each camper was able to work with a dog dedicated to them for the weekend, either their own personal dog or one of the trainer's dogs.

THE FORT WORTH CLAYMORES

The Fort Worth Claymores are a local youth shooting group that help kids through high school learn the basics of safety and general handling of firearms in a competitive environment. With the generous help of the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth, the Claymores have instructed youth and supplied them with needed equipment to include loaner shotguns, ammo and safety equipment. The Claymores also participate in several youth group fundraisers locally to give back and help them raise funds to continue their Christian group's efforts. Each year, in addition to 9 competitive shoots, the Claymores give instructional guidance to youth interested in joining the sport at no cost to them. With the help of the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth, we are making a difference in youth shooting sports.



FOSTER'S HOME FOR CHILDREN

It is truly exciting to see kids of all ages afforded a first-time outdoor experience. A child's first freshwater catch, the harvesting of a young boy's first deer, . Many of our kids are from the city and memorable outdoor experiences might never have seemed like realities. But thanks to organizations like the Fort Worth Sportsman's Club and Operation Orphans Hunt we are able to grant kids who live here opportunities they might not otherwise ever have.

John Wayne (Home 2) was able to harvest a nice little 8 point in early December with the boys who attended Operation Orphan Hunt in Mason TX. Xavier (Home 11), a young boy from Fort Worth, was also able to harvest his first deer, a doe, over the course of the same weekend. Tytus (Home 2) didn't get to pull the trigger on one but he caught a few nice bass in one of the ranch's tanks. Little Zayne from Home 16 did as well.

The Home 14 girls made good use of their funds. Over the course of the summer they went on a camping trip to Lake Brownwood where they boated and fished. They also took a trip to Branson, MO and were able to go kayaking on the lake there. Several of the Home 14 girls also went to Mason, TX in November for an experience with Operation Orphan Hunts. Lexi was able to harvest a really nice 8 point. Normally they don't allow the kids to harvest bigger deer but they gave her the chance and she pulled off a nice shot. Because I have a number of European mounts in my office that I did of my own deer, she asked if I would mind doing hers. I hope to have it done over the Christmas break.

I hope this affords you a bit of insight into the impacts your funds are having by kids at Foster's Home for Children. We are grateful for the generosity of the club. Thank you for granting our kids experiences they might otherwise never be afforded had they not been with us!

CASA of Johnson County is a non-profit organization that professionally trains community volunteers to advocate for the best interest of Johnson County's children in foster care. Our volunteers are required to complete 30 hours of pre-service training before being sworn-in as a Court Appointed Special Advocate or CASA volunteer. Without our professionally training volunteers our organization could not exist, as they are the core structure of our program.

Advocacy efforts for our children in foster care can look different for each child, and may include advocating for educational needs, such as, classroom or academic support; medical needs, such as, physical, or mental health support, etc. and advocating for the child's best placement possible while residing in foster care and simultaneously advocating for the child's forever home.

The financial support from Sportsmen's Club of Ft Worth assists us with ensuring that pre-service requirements are completed to include, but not limited to, costs associated with extensive background checks, printing of training materials, and resources along with cost of delivering training. The Sportsmen's Club of Ft Worth's financial support also assists with ensuring our volunteers can obtain their required 12 hours of continuing education, annually.

Children in foster care, many times are placed with as little as the clothes on their back and sometimes a few necessities; it is for these reasons that financial support such as that offered by The Sportsman's Club of Ft. Worth can assist CASA with fulfilling some of the wants/needs associated with the child's situation. Items CASA has purchased in the past include but are not limited to an urn to ensure the proper storage, handling and honoring of a child's deceased parent. Prom dresses, summer camps, senior rings, and graduation photos are other items CASA of Johnson County has been able to purchase due to support such as that provided by the Sportsmen's Club of Ft. Worth'. CASA has previously assisted with purchasing children's

medical devices not covered by insurance, such as helmets, and corrective shoes. Emotional support items have also been purchased, such as weighted blankets, noise canceling headphones, and sensory items.

Without generous financial support from such community organizations such as The Sportsmen's Club of Ft Worth CASA would not be able to fulfill the needs of our volunteers or advocate in the best interest of our children in foster care, which many times, includes advocating for things that help to make their time while in foster care a little more tolerable and "normal".

COLORADO ELK HUNT

This gives the lucky winner a very unique opportunity to hunt bugling elk during the peak of the rut with a rifle! The ranch is located near Burns, CO and borders the White River National Forest which is home to one of the largest elk herds in the world! The ranch consists of hay and alfalfa meadows on the lower portions (approx. 7,000') surrounded by cedar edges, the center portions are made up of rolling sage ridges with stands of aspen with the upper portions extending to 10,000' of mostly aspen and dark timber. Each day the guides and clients are transported by UTV or 4 wheel drive vehicles to their exclusive hunting area on the ranch, which allows them the opportunity to plan out their hunts knowing that the area is available for their use only.
