



## ASHLEY FAMILY HUNT

The idea of a family mountain lion hunt started when my wife (who has banished all of my mounts to a hunting lodge) mentioned that a full body mounted cat would look really good in our living room. Shocked at the comment, it took me all of about 5 minutes to make a phone call to David Smith to inquire about who to use as a guide. He invited me to the Sportsman's Club Banquet where I bought the hunt in the auction.

When I came home and told my wife "surprise you are going on a mountain lion hunt", I didn't actually think she would go. Man, was I ever wrong! My 8-year old daughter was listening in on the conversation and decided that in fact it would be her who was going with me and not my wife. As the two fought over who was going to get to go I decided we would all go and make it quality family time. My concern with this gamble on a family trip (planned over Christmas break by the way) was knowing that hunting can be a lot of down time, bad weather and may not have a happy ending. I also did not know how the outfitter would take a family hunting trip. Mossback was more than accommodating when I pitched it to them. This was more than an hunt, much more. In fact, the weather did not cooperate the first two days, but unplugging in nature together forced us to spend quality time.

We had a wild adventure and made memories that I know my daughter will tell her children. I don't know how you replicate hiking 2.5 hours in knee deep snow to end a hunt with a fire on the peak of a 8,000 ft. mountain. Surreal was the only way my wife knew how to describe it. My daughter being surrounded by a dozen hound dogs for 5 days (to

which she was determined to give equal attention) was in tears to leave Dropper, Skip and Ellie. Pictures just don't do justice to the memories we made. When asked what they wanted to do on our next vacation, the answer was "take us on another adventure Dad". Looks like there is an Ashley family bear hunt in our future.





Operation Orphans was founded in 1960, in part, with financial assistance from the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth. We are a non-profit organization that provides kids

from children's and foster homes in Texas a unique and wonderful experience by sponsoring hunting and fishing trips in the Texas Hill Country. Since the beginning, we have been fortunate to have hosted over 20,000 kids with over 18,500 animals harvested. In many cases, this is the kids first experience with the outdoors. This has not only helped local ranchers to control their deer population but also provided in excess of 780,000 lbs. of much needed meat for the homes. That is definitely a win/win. We currently host a boys fish camp, girls fish camp, girls deer hunt and 3 boys deer hunts yearly.

Our headquarters is located at Camp Gene Ashby in Mason, Texas. The camp borders the Llano river and our game pasture is stocked with aoudad, axis deer, fallow deer, black buck antelope and whitetail deer. The facilities are capable of safely accommodating 150 kids per hunt.

On arrival each kid is provided with a new pair of boots and makes a trip through our clothing room for hats, coats, gloves and other items of warm clothing. They are then taken to the mess hall for a warm nutritious meal homemade by some of our many volunteers. Then they are off to orientation where they are instructed in gun safety and explained what to expect for the next days hunt. Lights are out at 10:30 and breakfast is ready in the early morning. They are paired with a volunteer guide that is dedicated to spending the entire day with them instructing them and assisting them with the hunt. At the end of the day everyone is back at headquarters to show off their harvests and tell about the days hunt while enjoying another meal. Many of the animals are skinned and quartered by the kids themselves with the instruction from their guides. You can see the excitement in the kid's faces as they return and the camaraderie they have between each other and the guides as they accomplish a goal together. All of this is supported by donations from organizations like yours, the volunteers that help during the hunts and land owners that allow the kids to hunt on their properties.

After over 62 years the camp has needed a lot of repairs and updates. This year with the help of the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth we were able to redo the floor, doors, paint, replace the sinks and cabinets in our kitchen. We also replaced many of the old breaker boxes and wiring. It was great to see the kids faces when they walked into the new kitchen. These kids deserve the best we can give them and we really appreciate the support and generous donation for these kids. Our motto is "No Man Stands So Tall As When He Stoops To Help A Child". SCFW is standing tall. Thanks from the many volunteers and directors of Operation Orphans, Inc. and the children we all love.

Reel Recovery Texas Veterans Retreat supported by The Sportsman's Club of Fort Worth

Reel Recovery is a National non-profit organization that conducts FREE fly-fishing retreats for adult men living with all forms of cancer. The Sportsman's Club of Fort Worth honored the Texas Chapter of Reel Recovery with a very generous Grant to fund our September 2022 annual Retreat for Veterans with Cancer at Camp Capers in Waring, Texas.

Reel Recovery was founded in 2003 by a group of avid fly-fishers after witnessing first-hand the beneficial impact fly fishing provided their friend who was battling brain cancer. Warren Wolf brought Reel Recovery to Texas in 2008 after attending the 2007 Colorado retreat. Warren succumbed to cancer in May 2011. A core group of Texas volunteers were inspired to continue his mission to serve Texas men living with cancer. Retreats were gradually added throughout the State to our current six Texas retreats that can serve seventy-two men annually.

Reel Recovery combines introductory fly-fishing instruction with directed "Courageous Conversations". The organization offers a unique experience for men living with cancer, a time to share their stories; learn a new skill, form friendships and gain renewed hope as they confront the challenges of their recovery. Retreats are conducted over a two & 1/2-day period at a comfortable facility with on-site or nearby fishing access. Fly-fishing is an experience that provides relaxation, fun and an escape from daily routines. Fishing buddies are assigned to each participant to teach basic fly-fishing techniques, a connection with nature and a new skill they can continue to enjoy throughout their recovery and lifetime.

COVID-19 severely impacted our Retreat Program the last couple of years, but we have recovered to nearly full Retreat capacity for 2023. Reel Recovery did reach the milestone of serving over 4,000 men worldwide (US, New Zealand & Australia) including over 500 men served in Texas.

## THE FORT WORTH CLAYMORES

The Fort Worth Claymores is generously supported by the Sportsmen's Club and we have been able to host 9 competitive events this year with an average attendance of over 150 kids attending each competition. Kids ranging from 7th grade through high school seniors from the Fort Worth area schools are taught safety, techniques and discipline through volunteer coaches to help them excel in this sport at local ranges.





By supporting the C.A.S.T. for Kids Foundation, the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth makes a significant impact in the lives of children with special needs as well as the communities they live in. In 2022, SCFW supported 8 C.A.S.T. for Kids events. Over 500 volunteers celebrated over 275 children with special needs. These children along with their parents spent a morning fishing. For many of these families, it was their first experience fishing. This experience brings so much joy to the participants, their families, and the volunteers. As children catch their first fish, their excitement is contagious. After a morning of fishing, everyone gathers for lunch and a special awards ceremony. Each child is called by name to receive a personalized photo plaque, and they are given the opportunity to speak into the microphone and share their fishing story. This ceremony is always one of inspiration, because our participants are overcomers and encouragers. They never say 'can't', and they treat everyone as their very best friend. The world becomes a better place after every C.A.S.T. for Kids event. Together, because of your support, we are making the world a better place and celebrating some of the best humans on the planet! Sometimes, we have the honor of being inspired by an adult with special needs at an event. This year at Lake Leon, we met Raymond, a man over the age of 70, and he experienced his very first boat ride at our C.A.S.T. for Kids event. The impact that this experience had on every volunteer and every participant's family cannot be described in words. Joy and fishing. Inspiration and boat rides. Celebration and accomplishment. SCFW and C.A.S.T. for Kids Foundation make a great team. The words 'thank you' seem small in comparison to the impact of your generosity and support.

Support of Camp Fire First Texas Provides New and Improved Outdoor Programs for North Texas Youth

Thanks to generous funding from The Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth, Camp Fire Camp El Tesoro in Granbury, Texas, has expanded and improved facility equipment and activity programs. Such improvements allow the organization to provide even more exciting and engaging outdoor exploration opportunities to youth and their families who make the trek out to camp throughout the year.

Funding has seen two new archery ranges installed at Camp El Tesoro, allowing youth to learn safety and etiquette while growing their skills with a bow and arrow under the guidance of trained archery instructors. This activity is one that many campers have come to call a favorite.

The Sportsmen's Club is also responsible for Lake Leo being stocked with fish, such as bluegill and bass. In 2022, Camp El Tesoro launched its first

catch-and-release fishing program, where youth practiced casting, tackle selection, fishing etiquette, and safety precautions.

Vestal Odom, Camp El Tesoro Site Director, says fishing at Lake Leo has become one of the camp's greatest attractions. "When you see the smiles on kids' faces after they catch a fish, it's really something," he shares. "We've had many a happy kid catching fish down here - learning how to cast and bait hooks."

Most recently, funding from The Sportsmen's Club has made it possible for a dock to be constructed on Lake Leo.

By supporting Camp Fire First Texas, The Sportsmen's Club is not only providing North Texas youth the opportunity to shoot a bow, catch a fish, and maneuver a canoe. Such support also provides the opportunity for youth to learn, thrive, and achieve whatever they set their minds to.







I'm grateful that at Foster's Home for Children we encourage getting outside as much as possible. Some of our kids enjoy their time in the livestock show barn but the barn isn't for all of them. Very recently, we revamped our 4-H program and started our own chapter. I was elated when we had a few guys offer to lead a group to facilitate shooting sports.

In the fall, a friend of mine stopped by our campus, ironically, while we were offering the kids a hunter's safety class. He was passing through after having been in New Mexico hunting elk. He wanted to show me his harvest and I wish you could've experienced the exuberance of our kids as he let them handle the antlers of his harvested elk. He told them the story of his archery hunt of a lifetime. It was his first elk with a bow and I couldn't have been more elated he helped make it a teachable moment for our kids.

We really want the grant money we receive from the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth to be about teachable moments. Jamal and Nathan were both able to harvest their first deer, both of which were spikes. John, too, harvested his first deer, a nice sized doe. I love how men from the Lone Star Youth Hunts group took the time to show them how to field dress their kills. These boys will never forget this occasion.

Several of our staff took kids to a donor's property in Dublin TX (referenced in my grant request) for a weekend campout. They made a bonfire, fished in ponds, and canvassed every inch of the property they could. It was a great opportunity for them to get off the couch, turn off the television, sleep in a tent, and roast marshmallows by a fire. Does life get much better than that?

The caregivers in Home 14 continue to make good use of their grant funds. They have the high school aged girls, and while hunting isn't generally their thing they still love to be in the outdoors. The still boat and fish. They even rented kayaks and went all over Town Lake in Austin.

As a side story, my son graduated high school last year and asked to buy a fish as his graduation gift.

A high school friend of mine who guides out of Port Aransas took us for an incredible morning of catching specks but we closed it out with catching bull reds at the end of the jetties. I asked my friend and guide, "David, you think we can do this again next summer with a few kids from Foster's Home?" His response was, "You betcha!" And I can't wait to propose it for this summer.

These moments, some of which are seminal in the life of kids who live at Foster's Home for Children, are and hopefully will continue to be made possible by your gracious generosity. I simply don't have the words to adequately express how thankful I am that you see us worthy of your grant funds. They are most certainly affecting lives for the good. Good people affording kids from difficult situations with memories they'll take with them forever. That is good stuff in my book.

This July the American Warrior Association held its first Urban Explorers Program at Freedom Lodge in Hamilton Colorado. Urban Explorers provides warriors that have been through an AWA program a unique opportunity to continue their service by mentoring at-risk youth in America's under served communities. This program brings urban youth to the Rocky Mountains for five days to teach them outdoors man skills and mentor the next generation in the values of freedom and love for one's nation. It establishes impactful relationships and has a lasting positive affect on not only our nation's warrior class, but also the next generation of leaders.

In 2022 we partnered with Hope Farm, a local organization that provides leadership and guidance for at-risk boys and supports them on their journey to become Christ-centered men of integrity, and took eight boys, chaperones, and AWA warrior mentors and staff to Freedom Lodge for five days of outdoor adventure. Thanks to the generous donation from the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth we were able to provide the boys with all the hiking gear they needed for the week and offset the cost of activities.

The boys started each morning with thirty minutes of fun, outdoor physical fitness led by retired Navy SEAL Master Chief, Will Spencer, which taught them that you must put in the work to see results in all areas of your life. Activities during the week included hiking, learning to use a military compass and how to identify different plants and animals. The boys enjoyed horseback riding, fishing, and archery throughout the week as well. They heard stories of hard times that their warrior mentors have had and how they were able to persevere and overcome them. The boys learned how to be leaders in their communities, and most of all, they were able to gain a different perspective by removing all the distractions of daily life and find rest in the quiet of the outdoors. They gained a love for nature and the wilderness and truly understand the importance of preserving our natural resources.

Our Warrior mentors were able to continue their mission of service and find new purpose in their life while mentoring these young men. It was such a wonderful experience for everyone involved that we are expanding to three programs in 2023. AWA is extremely grateful to the Sportsmen's Club of Fort Worth for supporting Urban Explorers and for the relationship we have built with the Board of Directors. Without the support of organizations like yours we cannot continue to grow and expand our work and we thank you from the bottom of hearts.
